Dear Messrs Deputy Minister and Director of Public Prosecutions:

Re: G20 Toronto Conference

As the G20 Conference in Toronto is scheduled to commence on June 26th and is fast approaching, the AJC is concerned about the security of the over 400 members who work at the Exchange Tower, located at 130 King Street West. As you know, the Ontario Regional Office is situated along the north end line of the security perimeter, which is being erected around the conference site: see <http://www.g8-g20isu.ca/g20/resources/10-05-28-map.pdf>.

A proper briefing to the AJC is in order on the following questions:

1. Will members be permitted to make proper alternative work arrangements if operational requirements do not call for them to be present at 130 King Street West during the conference?
2. What security protocols are being implemented to ensure the safety of the members who are otherwise required to be present at 130 King Street West during the conference?
3. Have the DOJ and PPSC considered requesting brief adjournments or the relocation of any court or tribunal proceedings currently scheduled during the G20 conference that are assigned to members working out of the 130 King Street West location, and that will be heard either within the G20 security perimeter, or within its reasonable proximity?
4. What, if any other, information should those members who work at 130 King Street West possess in advance of the G20 Toronto Conference?
